Together for Justice

We are very pleased to report that we have received the funding from Status of Women Canada for our project “Together for Justice” to continue with the workshops in Watson Lake and Whitehorse. These workshops will enable women’s groups, community members, and the RCMP to develop and implement an action plan on preventing and responding to violence against women.

The Liard Aboriginal Women’s Societies (LAWS) goals for the project “Together for Justice” on Language, Violence and Responsibility is to promote a dialogue and improved relationships between Kaska women, Help & Hope for Families, government agencies in Watson Lake and Whitehorse, other women’s organizations, community members and the RCMP. Through the dialogue created between these organizations (LAWS) wants to address the serious abuse women in Yukon communities face and to help develop a plan to help address this abuse.

RCMP participation and their ongoing communication and cooperation with both women’s and community groups is key to building trust amongst all participants, and improving safety for women. The workshops will serve to educate all participants on safety, violence, responsibility, recovery and the importance of accurate language.

The overall project objective is to create lasting change, through the development of an action plan and Orientation documents that could be used by the RCMP, and/or a policy statement that can be used to inform and improve social service delivery and policing for women in Watson Lake and Whitehorse.

Thank you for your participation during our preliminary workshops “Bridging the Gap” in Whitehorse and Watson Lake in March of this year. As these workshops are progressive workshops building our knowledge each step of the way it is important that participants remain committed and attend workshops scheduled this fall and winter.

In 2009, the Youth of both schools in Watson Lake attended a workshop, facilitated by Jeff Cook, to seek their guidance on creating a healthy community. Here are some quotes from the youth based on that workshop:

- *“Youth are the future. The environment a child is raised in makes them who they are, and who they will be in the future. If they believe there is no hope, they will feel helpless. Bonds, relationships between teacher and a student or coach and a student or a councilor and a student might inspire them to stay drug and alcohol free, and to get a good education, to move out of this town. I believe the youth don't know that there is more out there. More opportunities, more people, and possibly a better life out of Watson Lake.”*
- *“My vision for Watson Lake is that everyone will be supportive and stay positive. We shall have more activities and less drugs and alcohol. I think the people will live a long healthy life.”*
- *“My vision for Watson Lake, Yukon: People will be more active and be positive about their life. They'll be able to look past Watson Lake and succeed in their education. People will look for positive influences and not run to alcohol and drugs. And every goal that they have will be accomplished. Things would be good if people could balance their emotional, mental, and spiritual values.”*
